It was on a rainy day when I had to take Natasha to the nearby dispensary to get tested for malaria. Some kids gathered around my car, mostly with no shoes and ripped clothes, trying to get my attention. I shook their hands and greeted them in Swahili as I walked into the clinic. (They aren't used to seeing white people in this area.) I felt so bad for Natasha and her illness I could not comprehend these children's needs. However when I looked at Natasha, she looked at the kids, and then looked back up at me with her big brown eyes; That's when I realized what Natasha already knew... she was one of the lucky ones. She could afford to get healthcare when she was sick. She has shoes to cover her feet, she had warm clothing when it rained. She is able to go to school. 
